

Primordial Soup - Whats the Recipe?

Dr. Ross Olson MD - When Stanley Miller created a few amino acids, "the building blocks of life," by passing an electric spark through gasses thought to represent the atmosphere of primitive earth, popular opinion seemed to be that life would soon be crawling out of his test tubes. This is an important area because the evolutionists' omnipotent creative force, natural selection, has to have living things to select.

But nearly a half century later and despite great advances in technology, we have seen no breakthroughs. In fact, the task seems even farther out of reach, because the simplest living creatures turn out to be complex beyond our wildest speculations.

If amino acids are building blocks, proteins would be buildings, from sheds to skyscrapers, and living cells would be like cities. It is mathematically foolish to expect a small protein molecule to organize itself from component parts under the most ideal conditions, much less a cell. Don't even TRY to think about the complexity of the human brain -- you might blow a fuse in yours!

TCCSA's STATEMENT OF BELIEF

We believe in God: The Father, Son and Holy Spirit. 
