Home school Classes. Because of Covid and then Amy's cancer I had to cancel all classes for 2021

Museum Attendance. Thank you, Jesus, and you who are our prayer warriors for praying. We had some small groups of 5 to 10 and several large groups to the museum this year. I also build 5 new exhibits. My great grandmother was Native American Ojibway Nation and I was certified to teach Indian studies in Minnesota. I just finished a Native American exhibit (At left) using Indian artifacts I had collected over the years. In my teaching I show how God sent missionaries before Columbus to reach my ancient relatives the Leni Lenape and Ojibway people.



Total number that came to the museum; 258 parents and students. This includes 3 times I loaded museum materials and took them to the students.

Amy Update. Praise. We just heard from the doctor that her white cells are up from 3.5 two months ago to 4.7 now. PTL. Before Chemo she was at 6.7 so her immune system is getting better so she feels safer to go out. She has about a 1/2 inch of hair growing back, too.

Prayer Request. We have been told that women who have ovarian cancer are 80% likely to get breast cancer. Plus, Dr Bai, her cancer doctor, had a genetic study done on Amy. The test shows that she has a genetic susceptibility to breast cancer. That means in her lineage cancer is more likely to occur. We see that is true as her middle brother died 7 years ago from nose cancer even though he had chemo. Her older brother, who lives near us, has lung cancer.



All this means she is even more likely to get breast cancer and they want to remove her breasts before any cancer is found. I am so sorry to sound negative but knowing the truth means we have to ask God for a miracle of healing. There seems to be no other way. We appreciate your prayers for this major challenge that we face. We hope to fly to Atlanta, Georgia in 2022 to a doctor there who developed a program that beat cancer without surgery and chemo treatment. We pray he can help Amy.
