

Teaching The Biotic Message

Tuesday, Jan. 20, 1998, 7:30 p.m. Totino Fine Arts Center, Rm. 115 Northwestern College, Roseville

Russ McGlenn of Adventure Safaris will present this topic and how he teaches it to home school students. We live in a world where there is a growing emphasis on the animal origins and nature of man. Yet the Bible always classifies mankind in relationship to God and never in relationship to the animals. The goal of this program is to help each student to see God's Biotic Message in every aspect of life around them, from the tiniest cell to the most complicated interaction of the human body's organs and bones. Some of the questions answered will be:

- What 10 things show that "Lucy" is not our great, great, etc. grandmother?
- What is the message that God has put in every living creature?
- How can it help us understand God's purpose for the creation?
- Why do humans and apes have anatomies that are similar?
- Why is evolution's worst nightmare variety in living creatures?
- Can mutations really change an ape into a human?
- What scientific concept, said to be the greatest argument for evolution, actually di Students, as well as adults love Russ' "hands on" visually creative programs. Biblica audiences see and touch the many artifacts Mr. McGlenn has built. Russ McGlenn will be bringing his latest model of Noah's Ark built to a 5/8 inch to the foot scale (GI Joe scale). It represents a 40 foot length cross section cut out of the Ark 75 feet across and 45 feet high. (two feet long by four feet wide by two and a half feet high) You and your children will want to see this remarkable model. Highlights include:
- A winch and pulley operated lift system for moving animals and equipment around the Ark.
- A complete apartment for Noah and his family.
- Various sized cages for the birds and animals.
- Over 100 model animals showing the pairs God commanded.
- A unique construction allowed Noah to build the lower hull of the ship without external scaffolding.

TCCSA's STATEMENT OF BELIEF

We believe in God: The Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
