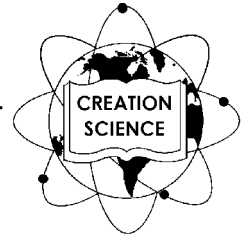

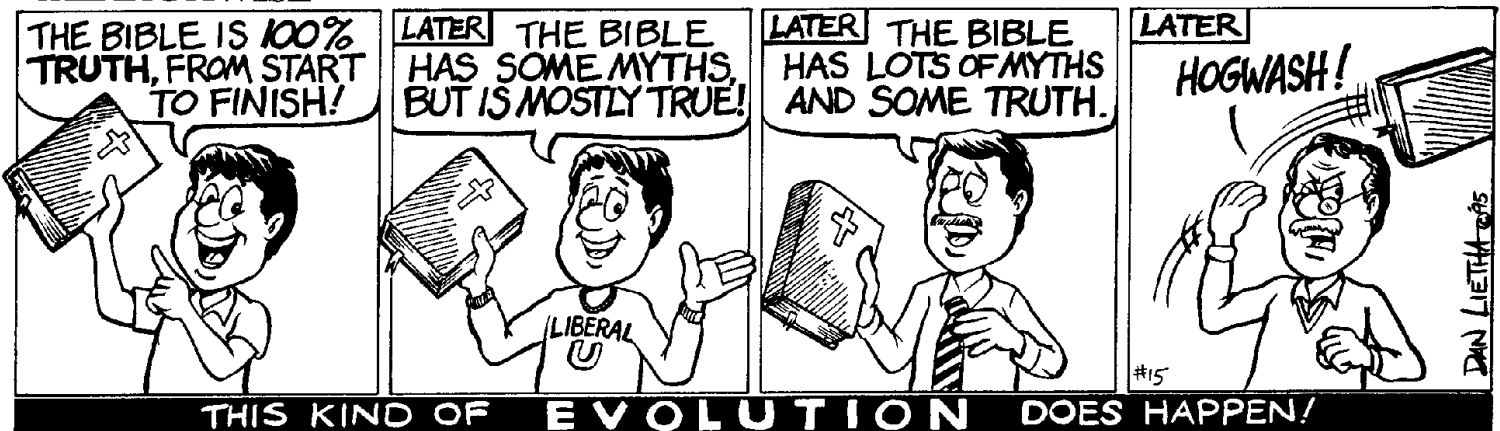

Adventure Safaris

The Third Annual Science Fair is February 6 & 7, at Har Mar Mall near Rosedale. Judging will take place Saturday morning. In past years this has been an interesting event for the whole family. We encourage everyone to come out to support the participants, **you will learn something.**

Three 5-day Dinosaur and Indian camps are scheduled for May at Devils Lake State Park, just thirty minutes from the Wisconsin Dells recreation area. Russ, his daughter, and son-in-law will draw from their Native American background to help you experience how Indians lived and what the Bible has to say about their origin and future. You will also learn about evidence of early Indian contact with dinosaurs.
