Have you considered...

...how birds "hear" blizzards coming. Birds have exceptional hearing; they hear in the infrasound range. Birds can actually hear bad weather approaching. You may have noticed that a day or so prior to a storm, birds are frantically feeding at your feeder. The birds heard the storm coming and preparing for it. Also, birds such as hawks and eagles can hear thermals. This is good because they depend on thermals to soar. Birds also can detect very minute differences in air pressure. You could say they have a barometer in their ears. Birds need to be very aware of the weather and the changes taking place in order to survive. God cares for the very life of His birds and has designed them to survive. As it says in Matthew 10:29 and 31, "Not one of them (sparrows) will fall to the ground apart from the will of your Father..." and yet we are "worth more than the sparrows."

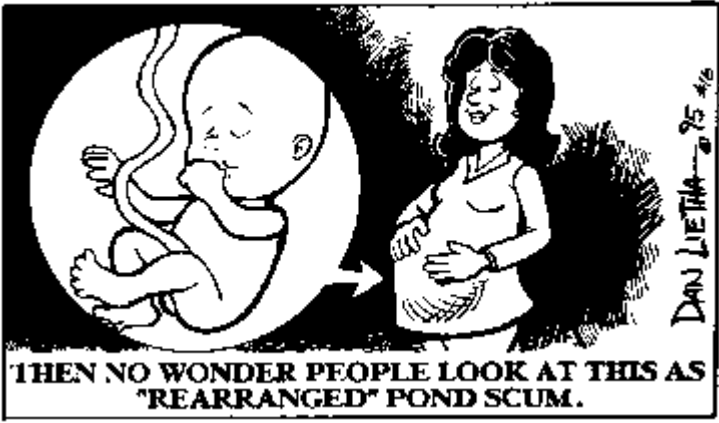
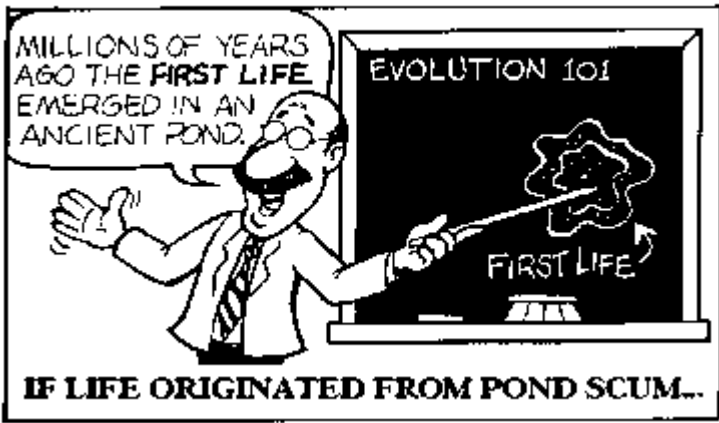

TCCSA's STATEMENT OF BELIEF
 We believe in God: The Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
