Have you considered...

...that man was intelligent in the past; consider the Vikings and their fabled magical sunstones. These sunstones or Iceland Spar or the transparent crystal called calcite would aid these ancient mariners when the days were so cloudy that the sun was obscure. Vikings write of using these prized sunstones to navigate the perilous Arctic seas. This transparent Island Spar crystal creates a double refraction or image. You can see this for yourself by putting Iceland Spar on a newspaper and seeing a double image appear. Vikings would mount this crystal of Iceland Spar into a wooden block and rotate it until the two bright images equalized; from that position the Vikings could determine the sun’s position. (The sun’s location enables you to know your latitude.)

Vikings as primitive, unintelligent people, hardly! God created man in His image (Gen. 1:26) and then sin entered in. Instead of evolution’s idea that we are moving up from the apes, we were created intelligent from the beginning.

THE KEN HAM – BILL NYE DEBATE This well-publicized debate was held February 4, 2014. - - - A note by Bill Overn Albert Mohler has done a masterful analysis of the debate. But from a personal standpoint, I will add a remark or two, since there may be a few who may react to my silence. For years nobody will debate on the side of evolution without first dis-allowing any mention of the origin of life. That would become a virtual forfeiture on their part, and certainly was a hard and fast rule in this debate. Yes, Ken missed some wide-open opportunities to clobber Nye's claims. You can't expect one man to have all the answers to such an infinite subject, but he has exceptional knowledge. By choosing the particular proposition used in this debate, Ken was able to bring the Bible and Christian faith directly into discussion, something that has never been done in my experience. Truly praiseworthy. In several of my personal debates my opponent did so, and I could use it to his disadvantage. The Science Dean at one University actually carried a Bible into debate, which he regretted. Nye talked a lot about radiometric rock dating. Since I have made a deep study of the subject over several years, Ken's dismissal with "You can never know the beginning point," certainly could not satisfy me. The acknowledged expert in rock dating for many years, Brent Dalrymple, late of the U.S. Geological survey, claimed to have dated 100,000 rocks using whole-rock 'isochrons', a rigorous mathematical method of finding the beginning point. But the subtle fallacy in his method, which I published, defeats that claim. Although that method is still widely used, Dr. Dalrymple, after consulting me, carefully avoided defending the method in his last book on the subject. So Ken's statement is correct that the beginning point is unknown. But since that fact is not generally understood, it would be derided by almost all who are aquatinted with the art.
