Evidence for the Flood of Noah

Tuesday February 20, 2024, 7:00 PM, Univ. of Northwestern, Totino Fine Arts Center, Room F2106

Can you explain where the water for a world-wide flood would have come from, and where it all went?! Many Christians can't. Understanding the flood (the purpose, the causes, the aftermath and the evidence) is very important to an understanding of a biblically sound creation model.

This session covers the basics about this event, and also includes a video & PowerPoint presentation on the "Hydroplate Theory". This theory is a biblically accurate and scientifically feasible portrayal of the flood event.

Mike Snavely is the founder and director of Mission: Imperative. He grew up in Africa as a missionary kid and has worked as a park ranger, wildlife artist and College teacher. He's a fascinating speaker who knows the Creator and wants to tell everyone about His creation.

Annual report from TCCSA

There is interest from members and friends of TCCSA to know how were are doing. Last year was an interesting year, our meeting attendance is still not as high as before Covid. Last year we averaged about 69 per meeting. Four meetings had our speakers speaking via Zoom from another state so those always have a smaller group meeting at Northwestern. Last February the meeting was kind of snowed out and only 20 showed up.

We give our speakers an honorarium of \$100 for local sand Zoom speakers and \$200 for distance speakers. in addition we pay for travel expenses up to \$400. We started with \$9786.31 in the bank and ended with \$9641.22. We didn't quite break even but not too bad. We also have books and other resources available for sale but when a speaker brings things to sell we usually don't sell our resources so only made \$251.00 in sales. We dropped the large snail-mail newsletter and reduced our mailing from about \$90/Month to \$19.



TCCSA's STATEMENT OF BELIEF

We believe in God: The Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We believe that the Bible is the inspired Word of God, and that all of its assertions are historically and scientifically true in the original autographs; this means that the account of origins in Genesis is a factual presentation of actual historical truths. We believe that the origin of matter and all basic types of living things, including man, came about through direct creative acts of God during the six-day creation week described in Genesis. Whatever biological changes have occurred since the creation week have accomplished only changes within the created kinds. We believe that the great flood described in Genesis, commonly referred to as the Noachian Flood, was an historic event, world-wide in extent and effect. Their subsequent fall into sin, by disobedience of God's direct command, is the basis for our belief in the necessity of a Savior for all mankind. Therefore, we believe that Jesus Christ is our Lord and only Savior and that personal faith in Him is necessary for salvation.

At that time our board included Jerry Roth, President, Beatrice Flaming, Treasurer, Bob Helfinstine, Rev. Walter Lang, Al Heitkamp, Ross Olson and Russ McGlenn are the ones I recall.
