Twin Cities Creation Science Association (TCCSA) is an organization dedicated to spreading the word that scientific evidence points unequivocally to creation and the accuracy of the Biblical timetable. This is contrary to not only the common secular view, but contrary to the assumptions of many Christians that evolution and millions of years has been proven and we must find a way to live with that as Christians. I once believed that way and was astounded by the actual evidence! When it is understood that the geologic record is actually strong evidence for a worldwide flood, the millions of years melt away. Moving water lays down sequential strata as demonstrated at Mount St Helens and quantitative studies can estimate the depth of water and current velocity that laid down the formations seen in the Grand Canyon. It is also clear that there would not be billions of fossils in the rocks if they had been laid down over long ages - the fossilized creatures would have long ago decayed! Recently intact blood cells and blood vessels have been found in fossils dated by secular authorities as hundreds of millions of years old. This is obviously impossible, but the promoters of evolution torture the evidence in an attempt to make it fit their conclusions instead of allowing the data to speak for itself. Indeed, the rocks cry out! The Biblical record claims that death entered the world as a result of sin. If millions of years elapsed before Adam and Eve sinned, then the Bible is discredited. But in reality, the evidence strongly supports the Biblical history. Despite these facts, many Christians and non-Christians believe the myth of evolution and deep time.

Twin Cities Creation Science is a Christian non-profit organization, for which contributions are tax deductible. It produces a monthly program held currently at University of Northwestern St Paul (located in Roseville) and maintains a website and has a variety of recorded programs on its YouTube channel. The website, www.tccsa.tc has information on the programs and the resources available. This website has a worldwide reach with visits coming from eastern Europe, including both Ukraine and Russia as well as Asis, including China and India. The TCCSA YouTube channel has records of previous meetings, some with thousands of views. This is repeated on Rumble.

Many youth have attended the meetings of TCCSA and many have had contact with the evidence for creation through the Creation Museum and Ark Encounter in Kentucky.

TCCSA is a low budget volunteer organization dependent on contributions and could benefit greatly if churches could put it on the budget for \$1000 a year.

TCCSA STATEMENT OF BELIEF
